

CITY OF GRANDVIEW ANTIQUE ALLEY GUIDELINES

APRIL 16-18, 2021

Antique Alley is almost here again. The City of Grandview recognizes this event brings many visitors, vendors and throngs of traffic to the area over the three-day event. It is a great time for our area businesses and visiting vendors to market their products. To that end, the following guidelines will help facilitate a safe and productive event.

LOCAL GRANDVIEW BUSINESSES:

- May use public sidewalk areas in the downtown area for displays as long as a minimum of three (3) feet is allowed along the “street side” for safe passage by pedestrians and wheelchairs. No portion of the street or highway right-of-way may be used or otherwise blocked.
- May use other outside areas located on their property that are otherwise accessible for temporary displays during the three-day event only. This would include side and rear yard open areas. For instance, a portion of green space behind a building that is not part of a public alley or right-of-way. All temporary outside display/sales must conclude at the end of day, April 18, 2021.

VENDORS/FOOD/MERCHANTS:

- All temporary vendors must obtain a vendor’s permit from the City of Grandview permit clerk at 1100 McDuff on or before 11:30 A.M. Friday, April 16, 2021. Vendors must provide a Texas Sales Tax Permit at the time of application. Food vendors, except for non-profit, must provide a Texas Sales Tax Permit and Texas Department of Health Certificate at the time of application.
- Temporary vendors, including food and/or merchandisers, may only set up on private property in the Grandview city limits with written permission of the property owner. No vendors may set up or operate from any public street, alley, or right-of-way within the city limits of Grandview.
- “Non-profit” organizations must register with the City of Grandview, but no permit fee will be charged as long as 501(c) exemption proof is provided.

CITY OF GRANDVIEW RESIDENTIAL “GARAGE SALES”:

- Residents of the City of Grandview wishing to conduct garage sales in conjunction with Antique Alley may do so, limiting their sales to items excluding food products that have not been prepared, maintained and served in accordance with Texas Department of Health Services permitting guidelines. No “garage sale” registration or permit is required for the Antique Alley event.

The three-day solicitor/vendor general provisions and permit application can be found under “Permits and Registrations” on the city’s website at cityofgrandview.org, but the permit application and fees can only be processed at the City Hall, 1100 McDuff on or before 11:30 A.M. Friday, April 16, 2021.
